Each coach develops daily schedules, coaching routines, and spirit circle content for the sessions. Additionally, they spend time monitoring and evaluating the impact of our curriculum with the girls. We are very grateful to have such an incredible group of women who are at the forefront of our operations.

Anjona joined Playquity in March 2021 as our first coach. She comes from the Balijan Tea Estate in Chabua, Assam and is inspired by her father and Mrinalini, her first Ultimate Frisbee coach. She has spread Playquity to three communities thus far (and counting) with Jeevan Shiksha. Apart from Frisbee, she drives herself towards reducing, reusing and recycling plastic that is not just harming humans health but affecting animals and the environment.






Wynonna joins Playquity with a

In addition to our existing NGO partners, we launched the Playquity curriculum with three new NGO partners in 2023! We have built partnerships with Rural Volunteer Centre in Assam, InSIDE NorthEast and MANEDA in Manipur in an effort to continue sharing the Playquity Program throughout India.

Together with the <u>Action</u>
Northeast Trust (The ANT), we have been able to identify rural communities and NGO partners to implement the Playquity curriculum.

We are happy to announce our partnership with <u>Kickoff</u>


