

Our team has been busy laying the groundwork for new initiatives in 2013, and in the 1st quarter, they are focused on developing relationships with the parents and communities at large. In the pages to follow, you will read about a fun event organized as part of the community outreach effort. In addition, we are making progress in connecting with parents by improving our home visit methodology. We have also started a program to work with street children in our communities, taking a human rights based approach to understand their needs and provide opportunities to enrich their childhood.

Building bridges

Pudiyador's vision is to "transform communities one child at a time", and this quarter, we took a step forward in involving the communities our kids come from. As part of the effort, we organized a community outreach event at Pudiyador Uroor Kuppam (PUK). The focus of the event was to bring this large community together and to raise their awareness about their own children's needs. Prior to the event, we had met with Tulir, an organization that focuses on the prevention and healing of child sexual abuse. With Tulir's permission, the event featured exhibition of Tulir's posters and other literature to bring about awareness in the community about child safety.

Preparations began almost two weeks before the event. In addition to the children, around 25 women from the community (mothers and others from the community at large) signed up and gathered at PUK for the pre-event kick-off. The pre-event featured activities for the mothers and the older children that were later showcased on the big day of the community event.



We started the pre-event with a mapping activity during which the women organized themselves into two groups and identified safe and unsafe areas within their community. A similar activity was repeated by the older kids from Pudiyador. In addition to identifying the areas, there were lively discussions among all groups on why a specific area was deemed unsafe. We now have a wonderful community resource in the form of a map that demarcates safe and unsafe areas within the community. We plan on following this up in the coming months with suitable interventions in the areas identified.

After this activity, the ladies bonded over artwork projects such as *kolam* designs and painting *saris*.

A photography workshop for children of ages 9-14 was a major part of the preevent kickoff. The workshop was conducted over 6 sessions, each covering specific aspects of photography like

texture, color, light, etc. Children were also taught how to portray community issues through photography. Three point-and-shoot digital cameras were shared between 15 children who were divided into groups. An adult mentor accompanied each group during their photo shoots. A totally of over 1000 photos were captured, of which 200 were selected and displayed during the community event (<u>click here to jump ahead to see some of the pictures</u>).

We wrapped up the pre-event kick-off by asking the mothers some questions (What do you know about Pudiyador? What are your expectations from Pudiyador? Can you spend time at Pudiyador?) and video recorded theirs responses. We were surprised to find that most of them did not completely understand what Pudiyador does, and that was an important learning moment for us. We will be doubling our efforts in getting the parents to understand our purpose. As for their expectations, mothers wanted us to teach their children to behave well, have healthy attitudes, respect their elders, and do well in school. We heard you, moms! Finally, a third of the mothers expressed interest in helping out at Pudiyador, especially during the summer camp. We look forward to spending more time with these wonderful mothers this summer!

The final community event was held two weeks later. We invited the entire community to the Pudiyador center. While it is typical for our children's mothers to be more involved with Pudiyador activities, this time, we were also joined by many of the fathers, grandparents, and other members from the community: over a hundred people in total!



After registration of attendees, we began the event with a parade of the kids and volunteers from the center (which is at the edge of the community) to the heart of the community. Then our children took to the stage and entertained the audience with several wonderful dance performances. The children showcased both traditional folk and classical dances through the evening.

In addition to the entertainment, there were two exhibitions - one of Tulir posters and the other of all the photos our children had shot in the weeks before the event. We engaged the community in discussions and provided explanations of both the posters and the photos displayed.

On a lighter vein, we had a photo booth where families could play "dress up" and create exciting photo memories. And finally we ended the evening with a game of tug of war which was loads of fun while engaging all attendees.





As a follow-up to the event, we plan on introducing specific interventions that will alleviate safety issues identified during the mapping activity.

We have also identified teenagers as a demographic that we should cater to with specific and targeted activities.

A number of men in the community have indicated an interest in a photo workshop and we plan on scheduling one for them. Needless to say, our community outreach and the event has encouraged wider community participation in Pudiyador's activities and generated a significant goodwill. We hope to continue building these bridges and strengthening our community ties.


